

EITWAN CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP 2013 PROGRAM



Archery: Scouts will learn safe archery handling and use a BSA approved equipment to earn the belt loop. Knowledge of the BSA rules and regulations as well as proper technique.

BB Guns: Scouts will learn safe BB gun handling and use on a BSA approved design Shooting Range. This includes safe

handling of any firearm; Scouts are taught what to do if they find themselves around a firearm, Stop – Do Not Touch - Back Away and Go Tell An Adult. In addition to earning the BB Gun Belt Loop and or Pin; Our goal is that by the end of camp each Scout have knowledge of how to safely handle and shoot a BB gun, as well as basic firearm safety at the Cub Scout level. Boys will earn their BB Gun belt loop too.



Other activities (not finalized depending on ranks and available certified staff might include):



Scout Skills: The boys will be taught how to handle tools, problem solving skills utilizing different materials, crafting a treasure chest (money bank) with the skills learned from this activity.

Crafts: Participants will utilize color and various materials to create various items including picture frames, treasurer chest, stepping stone and more.



Sports: Working on the 12 characters of scouting, scouts will spend their energy on the field by playing various sports and learning all about sportsmanship including playing tug of war, soccer, kickball, flag football, ultimate freebee and much more.

Catapult: The cubs might have a chance to launch a cannon ball (water balloon) at various targets on the scallywag seas. With the right trajectory, they may hit a bull's eye!

Science: Cubs and webelos will learn engineering, math and science by participating in experiments and inquiry based activities.

Fishing: How could a Cub be a worthy sailor at sea, without the necessary skills to catch a fish. Cubs this year will learn the proper skills to catch a fish and earn this achievement.
